#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING REQUIREMENTS GOVERNING THE IMPOSITION OF A FEE
102	FOR THE RESEARCH AND RETRIEVAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS UNDER
103	THE "COLORADO OPEN RECORDS ACT".

## **Bill Summary**

The bill allows a custodian of public records under the "Colorado Open Records Act" to impose a fee in response to a request for the research and retrieval of such records only if the custodian has, prior to the date of receiving the request, either posted on the custodian's web site

HOUSE 3rd Reading Unamended February 24, 2014

HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading February 21, 2014 or otherwise published a written policy that specifies the applicable conditions concerning the research and retrieval of public records by the custodian. Any fee the custodian charges the requestor for the research and retrieval of public records must be nominal in comparison to the time the custodian spends responding to the volume of requests. The bill prohibits the custodian under any circumstances from charging an hourly fee for the research and retrieval of public records that exceeds three times the state minimum wage.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72-205, add (6) 3 as follows: 4 24-72-205. Copy, printout, or photograph of a public record 5 - imposition of research and retrieval fee. (6) (a) A CUSTODIAN MAY 6 IMPOSE A FEE IN RESPONSE TO A REQUEST FOR THE RESEARCH AND 7 RETRIEVAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS ONLY IF THE CUSTODIAN HAS, PRIOR TO 8 THE DATE OF RECEIVING THE REQUEST, EITHER POSTED ON THE 9 CUSTODIAN'S WEB SITE OR OTHERWISE PUBLISHED A WRITTEN POLICY THAT 10 SPECIFIES THE APPLICABLE CONDITIONS CONCERNING THE RESEARCH AND 11 RETRIEVAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS BY THE CUSTODIAN. UNDER ANY SUCH 12 POLICY, THE CUSTODIAN SHALL NOT IMPOSE A CHARGE FOR THE FIRST 13 HOUR OF TIME EXPENDED IN CONNECTION WITH THE RESEARCH AND RETRIEVAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS. AFTER THE FIRST HOUR OF TIME HAS BEEN 14 15 EXPENDED, THE CUSTODIAN MAY CHARGE A FEE FOR THE RESEARCH AND 16 RETRIEVAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS THAT SHALL NOT EXCEED THIRTY 17 **DOLLARS PER HOUR.** 18 (b) On July 1, 2019, and by July 1 of every five year period 19 THEREAFTER, THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 20 APPOINTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-3-304(1), C.R.S., SHALL ADJUST THE 21 MAXIMUM HOURLY FEE SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION

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1	(6) IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERCENTAGE CHANGE OVER THE PERIOD IN
2	THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR
3	STATISTICS, CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR DENVER-BOULDER-GREELEY,
4	ALL ITEMS, ALL URBAN CONSUMERS, OR ITS SUCCESSOR INDEX. THE
5	DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH SHALL POST THE ADJUSTED MAXIMUM HOURLY
6	FEE ON THE WEB SITE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. ANY CUSTODIAN MAY
7	CHARGE A FEE THAT DOES NOT EXCEED THE MAXIMUM HOURLY RATE ONLY
8	WHERE THE CUSTODIAN HAS, PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE IMPOSITION OF
9	THE FEE, EITHER POSTED THE AMOUNT OF THE FEE ON THE CUSTODIAN'S
10	WEB SITE OR INCLUDED THE AMOUNT OF THE FEE IN THE WRITTEN POLICY
11	REFERENCED IN PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (6), AS APPLICABLE.
12	<b>SECTION 2. Effective date.</b> This act takes effect July 1, 2014.
13	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
