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A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING AN ANALYSIS TO DETERMINE WHETHER OIL AND GAS
102	OPERATIONS HAVE AN IMPACT ON HUMAN HEALTH ALONG THE
103	FRONT RANGE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill directs the department of public health and environment to conduct an analysis of human health and quality of life within the counties of Larimer, Weld, Boulder, and Adams with the intent of understanding any possible effects of oil and gas operations on communities within these counties. The department must consult with a newly created scientific oversight committee regarding the design and conduct of the analysis and preparation of interim and final reports on the analysis. The analysis will be conducted in 2 stages. Stage 1 will:

- ! Include a review of existing medical literature from peer-reviewed scientific publications on the effects of oil and gas operations on human health and quality of life;
- ! Identify conditions of interest that existing medical literature indicates might be related to oil and gas operations; and
- ! Culminate in a written report due December 1, 2014, and presented orally to committees of the general assembly by January 30, 2015.

Stage 2 will include institutional review board (IRB) approval, surveys, and case studies as follows:

- Tier 1 will include IRB approval by December 31, 2014; mailed and on-line surveys with individuals in the identified communities; and an interim report due January 1, 2016, and orally presented to committees of the general assembly by January 30, 2016; and
- ! Tier 2 will include IRB approval by February 1, 2016; case-control studies on at least 2 relevant conditions of interest identified in tier 1; and a final report due January 1, 2017, and presented orally to committees of the general assembly by January 30, 2017.

3	(4) (a) There is hereby created a scientific oversight
4	COMMITTEE TO WORK IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT
5	REGARDING THE DESIGN AND CONDUCT OF THE ANALYSIS AND
6	PREPARATION OF THE REPORTS REQUIRED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE
7	COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING THIRTEEN MEMBERS:
8	(I) NINE VOTING MEMBERS APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
9	(A) FOUR MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, NO MORE
10	THAN THREE OF WHOM MAY BE REGISTERED WITH THE SAME POLITICAL
11	PARTY;
12	(B) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
13	REPRESENTATIVES;
14	(C) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE
15	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES;
16	(D) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;
17	(E) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE
18	SENATE; AND
19	(F) THE CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER OF THE DEPARTMENT, OR HIS OR
20	HER DESIGNEE, WHO MUST ALSO BE A PHYSICIAN, WHO IS THE CHAIR OF
21	THE COMMITTEE; AND
22	(II) FOUR NONVOTING MEMBERS APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
23	(A) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO OIL AND GAS
24	INDUSTRY, APPOINTED JOINTLY BY THE COLORADO STATEWIDE OIL AND
25	GAS ASSOCIATIONS;
26	(B) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO ENVIRONMENTAL
27	COMMINITY ADDOINTED IOINTLY BY THE COLODADO STATEWIDE

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1	ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS; AND
2	(C) A STATISTICIAN AND AN ECONOMIST, BOTH APPOINTED BY THE
3	EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
4	(b) ASIDE FROM THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE, AT LEAST TWO
5	APPOINTEES TO THE COMMITTEE MUST BE PHYSICIANS, AND THE
6	REMAINING APPOINTEES MUST HAVE DEMONSTRATED EXPERTISE AND AT
7	LEAST A MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL DEGREE IN NO FEWER THAN ONE OF THE
8	FOLLOWING SCIENTIFIC OR HEALTH-RELATED FIELDS:
9	(I) PUBLIC HEALTH;
10	(II) ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH;
11	(III) EPIDEMIOLOGY;
12	(IV) TOXICOLOGY; OR
13	(V) BEHAVIORAL OR SOCIAL SCIENCE.
14	(c) THE VOTING MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL NOT HAVE
15	ANY DIRECT INVOLVEMENT OR PECUNIARY INTEREST IN, OR AFFILIATION
16	WITH, THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY.
17	(d) (I) The appointing authorities shall make their
18	APPOINTMENTS BY JULY 1, 2014, AND SHALL CONFER PRIOR TO MAKING
19	THE APPOINTMENTS TO ENSURE THAT THEIR APPOINTEES SATISFY THE
20	CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (5). THE
21	COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD ITS INITIAL MEETING BY JULY 15, 2014.
22	(II) AN APPOINTING AUTHORITY MAY REMOVE AN APPOINTEE FOR
23	CAUSE. IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY, WHETHER DUE TO REMOVAL FOR
24	CAUSE OR ANY OTHER REASON, THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY THAT MADE
25	THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT OR REAPPOINTMENT MAY APPOINT A
26	REPLACEMENT TO FILL THE VACANCY.
27	(5) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

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1	(a) "IRB" means an institutional review board established
2	IN ACCORDANCE WITH, AND FOR THE PURPOSES EXPRESSED, IN 45 CFR
3	PART 46.
4	(b) "OIL AND GAS OPERATIONS" HAS THE MEANING ESTABLISHED
5	IN SECTION 34-60-103 (6.5), C.R.S.
6	(c) "OPERATOR" HAS THE MEANING ESTABLISHED IN SECTION
7	34-60-103 (6.8), C.R.S.
8	(d) "SCIENTIFIC OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE" MEANS THE SCIENTIFIC
9	OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE CREATED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.
10	(6) This section is repealed, effective September 1, 2017.
11	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
