## **HOUSE RESOLUTION 14-1006**

CONCERNING NATIONAL PARENTS' DAY.

WHEREAS, In 1994, President Bill Clinton declared the fourth
Sunday of every July as National Parents' Day for the purpose of
recognizing, uplifting, and supporting the role of parents in the rearing of
children; and

WHEREAS, Since the inception of National Parents' Day, local
faith communities, elected officials, and activists throughout the nation
have creatively launched many activities around the theme of Parents'
Day designed to celebrate and strengthen two-parent families; and
WHEREAS, Barring high-conflict marriages, family structures
matter for children; and
WHEREAS, Numerous studies indicate that, on average,
two-parent families produce better outcomes for children; and
WHEREAS, A recent report by the Center for Law and Social
Policy concludes that most researchers now agree that studies support the
notion that children do best when raised by two-parent families; and

1	WHEREAS, Harvard economist Raj Chetty posits in his study
2	titled, "Where is the Land of Opportunity?: The Geography of
3	Intergenerational Mobility in the United States", that children of married
4	parents have higher rates of upward mobility; and
5	WHEREAS, New research from the Brookings Institute shows that
6	kids are more likely to climb the income ladder when they are raised by
7	two-parent families, thereby serving as a strong defense against poverty;
8	and
9	WHEREAS, Statistics show that children in two-parent families
10	have, on average, higher GPAs; and
11	WHEREAS, Statistics show that children in two-parent families
12	are less inclined, on average, to use illegal drugs, exercise poor sexual
13	decision-making, contemplate suicide, experience depression, engage in
14	criminal activity, drop out of school, or exhibit other harmful behaviors;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, Today in the United States, among women under 30,
17	more than half of births 53 % now occur outside of marriage; and
18	WHEREAS, It is becoming apparent to researchers that the
19	disappearance of marriage in Middle America is tracking with the
20	disappearance of the middle class in the same communities; and
21	WHEREAS, It has been noted that as a nation we have devoted
22	scant attention to the rapid disappearance of marriage in Middle America;
23	and
24	WHEREAS, Even as unstable cohabitating relationships,
25	breakups, and serial partnerships have become increasingly common in
26	Middle American families, our national leaders, presidential candidates,
27	and political parties seem to have barely noticed; and
28	WHEREAS, Economists have suggested that even a modest
29	increase in stable marriage rates would result in large savings for
30	taxpayers; and
31	WHEREAS, If family fragmentation was reduced by just 1%, U.S.
32	taxpayers would save an estimated \$1.1 billion annually; now, therefore,

1	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-ninth
2	General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
3	That we, the Colorado General Assembly:
4	
5	(1) Recognize and pay tribute to the fourth Sunday of July as a
6	day of recognition for the value of two-parent families; and
7	(2) Recognize that, given that children are more likely to flourish
8	educationally, socially, economically, and emotionally in intact married
9	families, the state of Colorado should pursue policies that strengthen the
10	quality and stability of married life in the state and that Colorado should
11	also strive to ensure that public policies do not unintentionally penalize
12	marriage so as to avoid discouraging the formation and sustenance of
13	healthy married families.
14	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Resolution be sent to
15	Former President Bill Clinton, President Barack Obama, Governor John
16	Hickenlooper, the National Parents' Day Coalition, and the National
17	Marriage Project at the University of Virginia.
