HOUSE RESOLUTION 14-1006

101 CONCERNING NATIONAL PARENTS' DAY.

1 WHEREAS, In 1994, President Bill Clinton declared the fourth 2 Sunday of every July as National Parents' Day for the purpose of 3 recognizing, uplifting, and supporting the role of parents in the rearing of children; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Since the inception of National Parents' Day, local 6 faith communities, elected officials, and activists throughout the nation have creatively launched many activities around the theme of Parents' 7 8 Day designed to celebrate and strengthen two-parent families; and 9 WHEREAS, Barring high-conflict marriages, family structures 10 matter for children; and 11 WHEREAS, Numerous studies indicate that, on average, 12 two-parent families produce better outcomes for children; and 13 WHEREAS, A recent report by the Center for Law and Social 14 Policy concludes that most researchers now agree that studies support the 15 notion that children do best when raised by two-parent families; and

WHEREAS, Harvard economist Raj Chetty posits in his study
 titled, "Where is the Land of Opportunity?: The Geography of
 Intergenerational Mobility in the United States", that children of married
 parents have higher rates of upward mobility; and

- 5 WHEREAS, New research from the Brookings Institute shows that 6 kids are more likely to climb the income ladder when they are raised by 7 two-parent families, thereby serving as a strong defense against poverty; 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Statistics show that children in two-parent families
 10 have, on average, higher GPAs; and

WHEREAS, Statistics show that children in two-parent families are less inclined, on average, to use illegal drugs, exercise poor sexual decision-making, contemplate suicide, experience depression, engage in criminal activity, drop out of school, or exhibit other harmful behaviors; and

- WHEREAS, Today in the United States, among women under 30,
 more than half of births -- 53 % -- now occur outside of marriage; and
- 18 WHEREAS, It is becoming apparent to researchers that the 19 disappearance of marriage in Middle America is tracking with the 20 disappearance of the middle class in the same communities; and
- WHEREAS, It has been noted that as a nation we have devoted
 scant attention to the rapid disappearance of marriage in Middle America;
 and
- WHEREAS, Even as unstable cohabitating relationships,
 breakups, and serial partnerships have become increasingly common in
 Middle American families, our national leaders, presidential candidates,
 and political parties seem to have barely noticed; and
- WHEREAS, Economists have suggested that even a modest increase in stable marriage rates would result in large savings for taxpayers; and
- WHEREAS, If family fragmentation was reduced by just 1%, U.S.
 taxpayers would save an estimated \$1.1 billion annually; now, therefore,

- Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-ninth
 General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
 - That we, the Colorado General Assembly:

5 (1) Recognize and pay tribute to the fourth Sunday of July as a 6 day of recognition for the value of two-parent families; and

(2) Recognize that, given that children are more likely to flourish
educationally, socially, economically, and emotionally in intact married
families, the state of Colorado should pursue policies that strengthen the
quality and stability of married life in the state and that Colorado should
also strive to ensure that public policies do not unintentionally penalize
marriage so as to avoid discouraging the formation and sustenance of
healthy married families.
