A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A SET ASIDE GOAL IN STATE PROCUREMENT FOR

102 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill establishes a goal that, in awarding contracts that are subject to the "Procurement Code", each state agency will award at least 3% of all contracts by dollar value to service-disabled veteran owned small businesses. To satisfy this goal, a state agency may grant a preference, either by evaluation or by allowing a set aside, for service-disabled veteran owned small businesses.

In awarding a contract to a business in furtherance of the 3% goal, a state agency is required to obtain verification from the business that the business is a certified service-disabled veteran owned small business by the United States department of veterans affairs.

The executive director of the department of personnel is required to submit an annual report regarding the state's progress in satisfying the 3% goal to the department of military and veterans affairs and to the committees of the house of representatives and the senate that have jurisdiction over state affairs and veterans affairs.

(1) AS USED IN THIS 6 SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: 7 (a) "SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESS" 8 MEANS A BUSINESS THAT IS: 9 **(I)** INCORPORATED OR ORGANIZED IN THE STATE OR THAT IS 10 MAINTAINING A PLACE OF BUSINESS OR OFFICE IN THE STATE: AND 11 REGISTERED AND (II)OFFICIALLY VERIFIED AS Α 12 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESS BY THE CENTER FOR 13 VETERANS ENTERPRISE WITHIN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF 14 VETERANS AFFAIRS. (b) "STATE AGENCY" MEANS A PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT OF THE 15 16 EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 17 24-1-110, INCLUDING ANY DIVISION, OFFICE, AGENCY, OR OTHER UNIT 18 CREATED WITHIN A PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING INSTITUTIONS OF 19 HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE COLORADO COMMISSION ON HIGHER 20 EDUCATION; EXCEPT THAT "STATE AGENCY" DOES NOT INCLUDE THOSE

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ENTITIES THAT HAVE ELECTED TO BE EXEMPT FROM THE CODE PURSUANT
 TO SECTION 24-101-105 (1) (b).

3 (2) IN AWARDING ALL CONTRACTS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO THIS
4 CODE, EACH STATE AGENCY SHALL HAVE THE GOAL OF AWARDING AT
5 LEAST THREE PERCENT OF ALL SUCH CONTRACTS, BY DOLLAR VALUE, TO
6 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES. TO SATISFY THIS
7 GOAL, A STATE AGENCY MAY GRANT A PREFERENCE, EITHER BY
8 EVALUATION OR BY ALLOWING A SET ASIDE, FOR SERVICE-DISABLED
9 VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES.

10 (3) WHEN A STATE AGENCY INTENDS TO AWARD A CONTRACT TO 11 A BUSINESS IN FURTHERANCE OF THE THREE PERCENT GOAL SPECIFIED IN 12 SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE AGENCY SHALL, PRIOR TO 13 AWARDING THE CONTRACT, REQUIRE THE BUSINESS TO SUBMIT TO THE 14 AGENCY DOCUMENTATION FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF 15 VETERANS AFFAIRS THAT VERIFIES THAT THE BUSINESS IS A 16 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESS.

17 (4) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2015, AND ON OR BEFORE 18 SEPTEMBER 30 EACH YEAR THEREAFTER. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL 19 SUBMIT A REPORT REGARDING THE STATE'S PROGRESS IN SATISFYING THE 20 THREE PERCENT GOAL ESTABLISHED IN THIS SECTION TO THE DEPARTMENT 21 OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS AND TO THE COMMITTEES OF THE 22 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE THAT HAVE JURISDICTION 23 OVER STATE AFFAIRS AND VETERANS AFFAIRS. THE REPORT SHALL 24 **INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:**

(a) THE NUMBER OF CONTRACTS THAT EACH STATE AGENCY
AWARDED TO SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES IN
THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR;

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1 (b) THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT OF CONTRACTS THAT EACH STATE 2 AGENCY AWARDED TO SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED SMALL 3 BUSINESSES IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR AND THE PERCENTAGE THAT SUCH 4 DOLLAR AMOUNT BEARS TO THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT OF CONTRACTS 5 AWARDED BY THE STATE AGENCY IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR; AND 6 (c) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED 7 SMALL BUSINESSES THAT RESPONDED TO SOLICITATION FOR BIDS OR 8 PROPOSALS ISSUED BY EACH STATE AGENCY IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR. 9 **SECTION 2.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 11 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
