102 PROGRAM FOR A PERSON WITH A BRAIN INJURY.

Bill Summary

Under current law, for persons with a brain injury, the transitional living program is limited to a 6- to 12-month period. The bill removes this limitation.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-6-703, amend
2	(10) as follows:
3	25.5-6-703. Definitions. As used in this part 7, unless the context
4	otherwise requires:
5	(10) "Transitional living" means a nonmedical residential program
6	that provides training and twenty-four-hour supervision to a recipient
7	over a six-to-twelve-month period that will enhance the recipient's ability
8	to live more independently.
9	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
10	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
