Bill Summary

For a person eligible for an old age pension, the bill allows the person to receive up to \$300 per month in gifts, grants, or donations without reducing the amount of the pension or reporting the gifts, grants, or donations.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-2-111, amend (2)
3 (b) as follows:

4 **26-2-111.** Eligibility for public assistance. (2) Old age pension. 5 (b) (I) An applicant or recipient of the old age pension who is otherwise 6 qualified shall not be denied the old age pension by reason of the fact that 7 relatives may be financially able to contribute to his or her support and 8 maintenance; except that income and resources of the spouse of an 9 applicant or recipient of the old age pension or of a sponsor of an 10 applicant or recipient of the old age pension who is a qualified alien shall 11 be considered in determining eligibility pursuant to rules of the state 12 department.

13 (II) IN CALCULATING THE INCOME AND RESOURCES OF ANY PERSON 14 WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR AN OLD AGE PENSION, THE STATE DEPARTMENT 15 SHALL DISREGARD THE FIRST THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER MONTH 16 RECEIVED BY THE PERSON IN THE FORM OF GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS. 17 THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT REQUIRE A PERSON WHO IS ELIGIBLE 18 FOR AN OLD AGE PENSION TO REPORT THE FIRST THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS 19 PER MONTH RECEIVED BY THE PERSON IN THE FORM OF GIFTS, GRANTS, OR 20 DONATIONS.

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SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill.

(1) For the implementation of this act, the general fund appropriation
 made in the annual general appropriation act to the controlled
 maintenance trust fund created in section 24-75-302.5 (2) (a), Colorado
 Revised Statutes, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, is decreased
 by \$51,593.

1	(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
2	appropriated, to the department of human services, for the fiscal year
3	beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$38,440, or so much thereof as may
4	be necessary, for allocation to office of information technology services,
5	Colorado benefits management system, for modifications to the Colorado
6	benefits management system related to the implementation of this act. Of
7	said sum, \$9,165 is from the general fund, \$1,235 is from the old age
8	pension fund created in section 1 of article XXIV of the state constitution,
9	\$13,121 is from reappropriated funds received from the department of
10	health care policy and financing out of the appropriation made in
11	subsection (3) of this section, and \$14,919 is from federal funds.
12	(3) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
13	appropriated, to the department of health care policy and financing, for
14	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$13,121, or so much
15	thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to department of human
16	services medicaid-funded programs, office of information technology
17	services-medicaid funding, Colorado benefits management system, for
18	system modifications related to the implementation of this act. Of said
19	sum, \$6,428 is from the general fund, \$34 is from the old age pension
20	health and medical care fund pursuant to section 7 (c) of article XXIV of
21	the state constitution, \$81 is from the children's basic health plan trust
22	fund created in section 25.5-8-105 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, and
23	<u>\$6,578 is from federal funds.</u>
24	(4) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
25	appropriated to the governor - lieutenant governor - state planning and
26	budgeting, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$38,440,
27	or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the office of

information technology for the provision of services to the department of
 human services related to the implementation of this act. Said sum is from
 reappropriated funds received from the department of human services out
 of the appropriation made in subsection (2) of this section.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 5 6 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 7 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 8 6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2014); except that, if a 9 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 10 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 11 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 12 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 13 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 14 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
