HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 14-1016

101	CONCERNING AN APPLICATION TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED
102	STATES TO CALL A CONVENTION FOR PROPOSING AMENDMENTS
103	TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROVIDE
104	THAT AN INCREASE IN THE FEDERAL DEBT REQUIRES APPROVAL
105	FROM A MAJORITY OF THE LEGISLATURES OF THE SEPARATE
106	STATES.

1 WHEREAS, Article V of the Constitution of the United States 2 provides authority for a Convention to be called by the Congress of the 3 United States for the purpose of proposing amendments to the 4 Constitution upon application of two-thirds of the legislatures of the 5 several states (amendments convention); and WHEREAS, The Colorado General Assembly favors the proposal
 and ratification of an amendment to said Constitution, which shall
 provide that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a
 majority of the legislatures of the separate states; now, therefore,

5 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-ninth 6 General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

7 (1) That, as provided for in Article V of the Constitution of the 8 United States, the Colorado General Assembly herewith respectfully 9 applies for an amendments convention to be called for the purpose of 10 proposing an amendment, which shall provide that an increase in the 11 federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the 12 separate states.

(2) That the amendments convention contemplated by this
application shall be entirely focused upon and exclusively limited to the
subject matter of proposing for ratification an amendment to the
Constitution of the United States providing that an increase in the federal
debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate
states.

(3) That this application constitutes a continuing application in
accordance with Article V of the Constitution of the United States until
at least two-thirds of the legislatures of the several states have made
application for an equivalently limited amendments convention.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
 to the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the
 United States House of Representatives, to each member of Colorado's
 congressional delegation, and to the presiding officers of each house of
 the several state legislatures, requesting their cooperation in applying for
 the amendments convention limited to the subject matter contemplated by
 this Joint Resolution.
