A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING REDUCING THE FREQUENCY OF ADMINISTERING THE
102	STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT IN SOCIAL STUDIES, AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, REDUCING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the department of education (department) must administer the statewide assessment in social studies annually to students enrolled in a single selected elementary grade, middle school grade, and high school grade. SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended May 5, 2014

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading May 2, 2014 The bill delays administration of the social studies assessment in high school by one year. After all of the students enrolled in the grade selected for testing in each elementary, middle, and high school in the state have taken the social studies assessment once, the department of education may choose to administer the social studies assessment annually to a representative sample of public schools so long as it administers the assessment in each public school at least once every 3 years. If the department chooses a 3-year assessment schedule, a school district or a charter school may ask the department to administer the test in a public school that is not scheduled.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-409, **amend** (1) 2 3 (k) as follows: 4 22-7-409. Assessments - repeal. (1) Beginning in the spring 5 semester of 1997, the department shall implement the Colorado student 6 assessment program under which the department shall administer 7 statewide assessments adopted by the board pursuant to section 22-7-406 8 in the first priority areas of reading, writing, mathematics, and science. 9 The department shall administer the English versions of the state 10 assessments and may administer any assessments adopted by the board in 11 languages other than English, as may be appropriate for students with 12 limited English proficiency; except that any student who has participated 13 in the English language proficiency program, created pursuant to section 14 22-24-104, for more than a total of three school years shall be ineligible 15 to take the assessments in a language other than English. The statewide 16 assessments shall be administered as follows: 17 (k) Beginning in the 2013-2014 school year, and each school year 18 IN SCHOOL YEARS thereafter, the department shall administer a 19 STANDARDS-BASED statewide assessment in social studies to students

25	IN THE SCHOOL YEAR FOLLOWING THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH IT RECEIVES
26	THE REQUEST.

SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to 2014 long bill.
