12 13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, El Paso County has endured two of the most devastating fires in Colorado history within a one-year period: The 2012 Waldo Canyon fire, which killed two people, destroyed 347 homes, and necessitated the evacuation of 32,000 people, and the 2013 Black Forest fire, which killed two people, destroyed 486 homes, and displaced 41,000 residents; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, The Medical Reserve Corps of El Paso County had prepared for this kind of emergency during a training exercise called "Up in Smoke", in which participants practiced coordinating with local emergency responders; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, The Medical Reserve Corps of El Paso County responded within 45 minutes of being activated, for both the Waldo Canyon fire and the Black Forest fire; and
25 26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, During and after both fires, volunteers from the Medical Reserve Corps of El Paso County provided medical and behavioral health support at mass care shelters associated with the City of Colorado Springs Office of Emergency Management, the El Paso County Department of Public Health, and the Pikes Peak chapter of the American Red Cross; and
31 32 33 34	WHEREAS, The Medical Reserve Corps of El Paso County mobilized 88 volunteers who contributed 1,644 hours of service during the Waldo Canyon fire and mobilized 56 volunteers who contributed 450 hours of service during the Black Forest fire; now, therefore,
