Bill Summary

The bill increases the statutory cap on the 2-year average of the unobligated portion of the oil and gas conservation and environmental response fund from \$4 million to \$6 million.

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 34-60-122, amend
3 (1) (b) as follows:

34-60-122. Expenses - fund created. (1) (b) On and after July
1, 2007 2014, the commission shall ensure that the two-year average of
the unobligated portion of the fund does not exceed four SIX million
dollars and that there is an adequate balance in the environmental
response account created pursuant to subsection (5) of this section to
address environmental response needs.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
