A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING ENSURING ACCESS TO QUALITY COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY IN THE MEDICAID PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing (department) to recognize complex rehabilitation technology as a specific need of persons with complex diagnoses or medical conditions that result in significant physical or functional needs.

The department must designate appropriate billing codes as

complex rehabilitation technology and establish supplier quality standards for complex rehabilitation technology suppliers. Additionally, the department must require evaluation of complex needs patients by qualified professionals for purposes of identifying appropriate complex rehabilitation technology. Further, the department must develop pricing policies for complex rehabilitation technology.

The bill defines terms relating to complex rehabilitation technology.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25.5-5-323 as

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

(1) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND 6 DECLARES IT IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF 7 COLORADO TO: 8 PROTECT ACCESS FOR COMPLEX NEEDS PATIENTS TO (a) 9 IMPORTANT TECHNOLOGY AND SUPPORTING SERVICES; 10 (b) ESTABLISH AND IMPROVE SAFEGUARDS RELATING TO THE 11 DELIVERY AND PROVISION OF MEDICALLY NECESSARY COMPLEX 12 REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY; 13 (c) PROVIDE SUPPORTS FOR COMPLEX NEEDS PATIENTS TO STAY IN 14 THE HOME OR COMMUNITY SETTING, PREVENT INSTITUTIONALIZATION, 15 AND PREVENT HOSPITALIZATION AND OTHER COSTLY SECONDARY 16 COMPLICATIONS; AND 17 (d) ESTABLISH ADEQUATE PRICING FOR COMPLEX REHABILITATION 18 TECHNOLOGY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ALLOWING CONTINUED ACCESS TO 19 APPROPRIATE PRODUCTS AND RELATED SERVICES. 20 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE 21 **REQUIRES:**

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2 DIAGNOSIS OR MEDICAL CONDITION THAT RESULTS IN SIGNIFICANT 3 PHYSICAL OR FUNCTIONAL NEEDS AND CAPACITIES. "COMPLEX NEEDS 4 PATIENT" INCLUDES INDIVIDUALS WITH PROGRESSIVE OR DEGENERATIVE 5 NEUROMUSCULAR DISEASES, CONGENITAL DISORDERS, OR INJURIES OR 6 TRAUMA THAT RESULTED IN SIGNIFICANT PHYSICAL OR FUNCTIONAL NEEDS 7 AND CAPACITIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO INDIVIDUALS WITH 8 SPINAL CORD INJURY, TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY, CEREBRAL PALSY, 9 MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY, SPINA BIFIDA, OSTEOGENESIS IMPERFECTA, 10 ARTHROGRYPOSIS, AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS, MULTIPLE 11 SCLEROSIS, DEMYELINATING DISEASE, MYELOPATHY, MYOPATHY, 12 PROGRESSIVE MUSCULAR ATROPHY, ANTERIOR HORN CELL DISEASE, 13 POST-POLIO SYNDROME, CEREBELLAR DEGENERATION, DYSTONIA, 14 HUNTINGTON'S DISEASE, SPINOCEREBELLAR DISEASE, AND CERTAIN TYPES 15 OF AMPUTATION, PARALYSIS, OR PARESIS THAT RESULT IN SIGNIFICANT 16 PHYSICAL OR FUNCTIONAL NEEDS AND CAPACITIES. 17 (b) (I) "COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY" MEANS 18 MEDICALLY NECESSARY DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AND ITEMS THAT 19 ARE INDIVIDUALLY CONFIGURED FOR INDIVIDUALS TO MEET THEIR SPECIFIC 20 AND UNIQUE MEDICAL, PHYSICAL, AND FUNCTIONAL NEEDS AND 21 CAPACITIES FOR BASIC ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING AND INSTRUMENTAL 22 ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING OF A COMPLEX NEEDS PATIENT. SUCH 23 EQUIPMENT AND ITEMS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, INDIVIDUALLY 24 CONFIGURED POWER WHEELCHAIRS AND ACCESSORIES, INDIVIDUALLY 25 CONFIGURED MANUAL WHEELCHAIRS AND ACCESSORIES, ADAPTIVE 26 SEATING AND POSITIONING SYSTEMS AND ACCESSORIES, AND OTHER 27 SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT SUCH AS STANDING FRAMES AND GAIT TRAINERS.

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(a) "COMPLEX NEEDS PATIENT" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A

8	(b) ADOPTING SPECIFIC SUPPLIER STANDARDS, AS DESCRIBED IN
9	PARAGRAPH (e) OF SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, FOR COMPANIES OR
10	ENTITIES THAT PROVIDE COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY AND
11	RESTRICTING THE PROVISION OF COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY
12	TO THOSE COMPANIES OR ENTITIES THAT MEET THE SUPPLIER STANDARDS;
13	(c) REQUIRING COMPLEX NEEDS PATIENTS RECEIVING CERTAIN
14	COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY, SUCH AS INDIVIDUALLY
15	CONFIGURED POWER WHEELCHAIRS AND ACCESSORIES, INDIVIDUALLY
16	CONFIGURED MANUAL WHEELCHAIRS AND ACCESSORIES, ADAPTIVE
17	SEATING AND POSITIONING SYSTEMS AND ACCESSORIES, AND OTHER
18	SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT SUCH AS STANDING FRAMES AND GAIT TRAINERS,
19	TO BE EVALUATED BY:
20	(I) A QUALIFIED HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL, INCLUDING BUT NOT
21	LIMITED TO A LICENSED PHYSICAL THERAPIST, A LICENSED OCCUPATIONAL

3	(I) Ensuring that the reimbursement amounts for complex
4	REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY AND SUPPORTING CLINICAL COMPLEX
5	REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES ARE ADEQUATE TO PROVIDE

18	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-5-404, add (1)
19	(v) as follows:
20	25.5-5-404. Selection of managed care entities. (1) In addition
21	to any other criteria specified in rule by the state board, in order to
22	participate in the managed care system, the MCE shall comply with
23	specific criteria that include, but are not limited to, the following:
24	(v) THE MCE SHALL COMPLY WITH PROVISIONS RELATING TO
25	COMPLEX REHABILITATION TECHNOLOGY ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE
26	DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 25.5-5-323.
27	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

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takes effect January 1, 2015; except that, if a referendum petition is filed 1 2 pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this 3 act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period 4 after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the 5 6 general election to be held in November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on January 1, 2015, or on the date of the official declaration of the 7 8 vote thereon by the governor, whichever is later.

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
