A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING ELIMINATION OF RESTRICTIONS ON THE ABILITY OF 102 ALTERNATIVE HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS TO TREAT CHILDREN.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law prohibits complementary and alternative health care practitioners and registered naturopathic doctors (alternative health care providers) from treating children under 2 years of age and requires those providers to obtain parental consent and make specified disclosures to parents before treating a child 2 years of age or older but less than 8 years of age.

The bill repeals the restrictions on the ability of alternative health care providers to treat children of any age.

8	section who is not licensed, certified, or registered by the state shall not:
9	(m) Treat a child who is under two years of age;
10	(n) Treat a child who is two years of age or older but less than
11	eight years of age unless the complementary and alternative health care

14	SECTION <u>2.</u> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby
15	finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
