HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 14-1005

101 **CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF MILITARY, VETERANS, AND MIA/POW**
102 **APPRECIATION DAY.**

1 WHEREAS, Colorado has a proud and distinguished history of
2 dedicated military service by men and women of this state whose courage,
3 heroism, and sacrifice preserve the liberties and democratic way of life set
4 forth in our state and federal constitutions; and

5 WHEREAS, Colorado benefits significantly from the presence and
6 military service of the more than 53,000 men and women in our state who
7 serve in the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and
8 Coast Guard; the branch Reserves; the Colorado National Guard; and the
9 Civil Air Patrol; and

1 WHEREAS, The men and women of the Colorado National Guard
2 have served in defense of our nation and as the first military responders
3 in support of civil authorities during domestic emergencies and are
4 celebrating their 154th anniversary this year; and

5 WHEREAS, In times of conflict around the globe, it is particularly
6 appropriate to recognize the Coloradans in all branches and components
7 of the Armed Services who serve around the world to protect the security
8 and peace of our nation and other nations; and

9 WHEREAS, In addition to active members of the Armed Services,
10 Colorado is the proud home of more than 391,000 military veterans who
11 have served their country long and well and who bring great honor and
12 distinction to the state; and

13 WHEREAS, Colorado is home not only to active duty service
14 personnel and veterans but also to the countless family members of these
15 men and women who display the same dedication, courage, and sacrifice;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, We should also never forget the sacrifices made for
18 us by the 94 men from Colorado declared missing in action or prisoners
19 of war while defending the principles of liberty and justice in conflicts in
20 Korea, Laos, and Vietnam; now, therefore,

21 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-ninth*
22 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:*

23 (1) That we, the members of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
24 hereby extend our heartfelt gratitude to our state's veterans, past and
25 present, to all military men and women currently serving in the Armed
26 Services, and to the family members of active duty personnel and
27 veterans, and that we remember and honor those prisoners of war and
28 those missing in action from previous conflicts; and

29 (2) That we encourage the citizens of Colorado to join in the
30 celebration of Colorado's Military, Veterans, and MIA/POW
31 Appreciation Day on January 27, 2014, in recognition and honor of the
32 thousands of fellow citizens in the military who protect and serve their
33 communities, state, and country.
