Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that adds a provision appropriating a total of \$2,000,000 cash funds to the Department of Natural Resources from the Colorado Water Conservation Board Construction Fund for FY 2015-16.

Points to Consider

Future Fiscal Impact

Pursuant to Section 39-29-109 (2) (b), C.R.S., 25.0 percent of total severance tax receipts are credited to the Severance Tax Operational Fund. This revenue is further divided between Tier I and Tier II programs. Tier II programs are subject to proportional reductions if there is insufficient Operational Fund revenue after Tier 1 appropriations have been met. This bill would increase Tier

It obligations by \$2.0 million per year for two years. However, based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast, proportional reductions are not expected in either FY 2015-16 or FY 2016-17.
