**Summary of Legislation**

The General Fund Exempt Account consists of the revenues the state retains and spends under the authority of Referendum C of 2005. Based on existing statute, one-third of the Referendum C revenue that exceeds \$55.0 million must be appropriated for the benefit of students attending institutions of higher education. Current statute specifically identifies qualifying higher education appropriations as student stipends, fee-for-service contracts with governing boards, need- and merit-based aid, and capital construction appropriations.

This bill, ***recommended by the Joint Budget Committee***, adds to the list of qualifying higher education appropriations: work-study programs, tuition for qualified Indian pupils who attend Fort Lewis College, local district junior college grants, and area vocational school grants.

**State Expenditures**

The bill expands the authorized uses for appropriations from the General Fund Exempt Account (exempt account). The amount of the total appropriation for higher education is determined annually by the General Assembly. The governing boards at the institutions of higher education make all budget decisions once state appropriations are allocated to the schools. This bill expands the authorized uses for which governing boards may spend from their portion of the allocation of the exempt account.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
