Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

- **J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$94,441 General Fund to the Department of Law for FY 2015-16. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.8 FTE to implement the act.
- L.002 Bill Sponsor amendment L.002 (attached) makes technical and clarifying changes to the bill. However, Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the amendment does not change the fiscal impact of the bill as discussed in the Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note, dated February 20, 2015. The Committee should adopt amendment J.001 regardless of whether or not it adopts amendment L.002.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
