#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$3.3 million General Fund to the Skilled Worker Outreach, Recruitment, and Key Training Grant Program Fund for FY 2015-16. The provision also appropriates a total of \$3.3 million from the Skilled Worker Outreach, Recruitment, and Key Training Grant Program Fund to the Department of Labor and Employment for FY 2015-16. The provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 2.0 FTE.

# **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
