Summary of Legislation

The bill creates the School Safety and Youth Mental Health Committee to study issues related to school safety and the prevention of threats to the safety of students, teachers, administrators, employees, and volunteers present on the grounds of public and private schools. The committee will study and evaluate programs and methods for identifying and monitoring students in crisis and develop standardized criteria for school personnel to use in assessing potential threats. The committee will make recommendations to the General Assembly concerning potential legislation to enhance school safety.

The committee will include eight voting legislative members and six nonvoting nonlegislative members representing various professions and backgrounds addressed in the bill. Appointments must be made by June 1, 2015, and each member may serve indefinitely. The eight voting legislative members may receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses and nonlegislative members will serve without compensation or reimbursement of expenses. Legislative Council Staff will provide staff support to the committee and the committee will meet at least four times each legislative interim and may meet as necessary throughout the year.

State Expenditures

The bill increases costs in the Legislative Department by \$29,576 and 0.3 FTE in FY 2015-16 and \$29,713 and 0.3 FTE in FY 2016-17. The bill requires Legislative Council Staff to provide support to the committee. The fiscal note assumes that the committee will meet six times a year. Legislative Council Staff will require 0.3 FTE to help organize meetings, provide technical assistance, and assist in drafting committee recommendations each year.

The bill allows the eight appointed legislative voting members of the committee to receive per diem and necessary travel expenses. The fiscal note assumes this will cost on average \$187 per member per meeting and that the committee will meet six times for an annual cost of \$8,976 in both FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17.

Centrally appropriated costs. Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

State Appropriations

In FY 2015-16, the bill requires an appropriation of \$25,857 General Fund and an allocation of 0.3 FTE to the Legislative Department.
