	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF A THERAPEUTIC ALTERNATE DRUG
102	SELECTION TO PATIENTS RESIDING IN CERTAIN LONG-TERM
103	CARE FACILITIES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill authorizes a licensed pharmacist to provide therapeutic alternate drug selections, either a therapeutic interchange selection or a therapeutically equivalent selection, as those terms are defined, to a patient if, during the patient's stay at a licensed nursing care facility or a long-term acute care hospital, the selection has been approved:

- ! In accordance with written guidelines and procedures for making therapeutic alternate drug selections as developed by the nursing care facility or the long-term acute care hospital; and
- ! By a licensed physician, a licensed physician assistant under the supervision of a licensed physician, or a licensed nurse registered as an advanced practice nurse and authorized to prescribe controlled substances or prescription drugs who has entered into a written agreement to collaborate with a licensed physician.

If a licensed nursing care facility or a long-term acute care hospital has an existing quality assessment and assurance committee of which a licensed pharmacist is a member, the bill authorizes the committee to develop a facility formulary with written guidelines and procedures for making therapeutic interchange and therapeutically equivalent selections from the formulary. If a nursing care facility or a long-term acute care hospital does not have an existing quality assessment and assurance committee of which a licensed pharmacist is a member, the bill authorizes the facility to form such a committee and develop a facility formulary with written guidelines and procedures for making therapeutic interchange and therapeutically equivalent selections from the formulary.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-102, **amend**

3 (31); and **add** (39.7) as follows:

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12-42.5-102. Definitions. As used in this article, unless the context otherwise requires or the term is otherwise defined in another part of this article:

- (31) "Practice of pharmacy" means:
 - (a) The interpretation, evaluation, implementation, and dispensing of orders; participation in drug and device selection, drug administration, drug regimen reviews, and drug or drug-related research; provision of patient counseling; and the provision of those acts or services necessary to provide pharmaceutical care in all areas of patient care; and
 - (b) (I) The preparation, mixing, assembling, packaging, labeling,

2	(II) Proper and safe storage of drugs or devices; and
3	(III) The maintenance of proper records for such drugs and
4	devices; AND
5	(c) THE PROVISION OF A THERAPEUTIC INTERCHANGE SELECTION
