A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE STATE ENGINEER'S AUTHORITY TO ALLOW WELL
102	USERS TO LOWER THE WATER TABLE IN AN AREA OF GILCREST,
103	COLORADO, THAT THE STATE ENGINEER DETERMINES IS
104	EXPERIENCING DAMAGING HIGH GROUNDWATER LEVELS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill authorizes the state engineer, for the purpose of lowering the water table in an area that the state engineer determines is experiencing damaging high groundwater levels, to rescind an order or to decline to order a well user in the area to discontinue an out-of-priority diversion or to replace an amount of water otherwise required by an augmentation plan or a substitute water supply plan.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 37-60-121, add (10) 3 as follows: 4 37-60-121. Colorado water conservation board construction 5 fund - creation of - nature of fund - funds for investigations contributions - use for augmenting the general fund - funds created 6 7 - repeal. (10) Emergency dewatering grant program and data 8 collection - fund - creation - legislative declaration. (a) (I) THE 9 GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT HIGH GROUNDWATER 10 LEVELS IN THE AREA OF GILCREST, COLORADO, ARE DAMAGING CROPS 11 AND FLOODING BASEMENTS AND SEPTIC SYSTEMS. TO MITIGATE THE 12 DAMAGING HIGH GROUNDWATER LEVELS, THE WATER TABLE NEEDS TO BE 13 LOWERED IMMEDIATELY TO A LEVEL THAT IS NO LONGER DAMAGING BY 14 MEANS OF EMERGENCY PUMPING OF WELLS THAT ARE: 15 LOCATED WITHIN OR NEAR THE AREA OF GILCREST, (A) 16 COLORADO: AND 17 (B) PERMITTED FOR DEWATERING. 18 (II) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS AND DETERMINES 19 THAT REAL-TIME DATA COLLECTION SHOULD ACCOMPANY THE 20 EMERGENCY PUMPING OF DEWATERING WELLS. 21 (III) THEREFORE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS, DETERMINES, 22 AND DECLARES THAT THE STATE OF COLORADO SHOULD FACILITATE THE 23 EMERGENCY PUMPING OF DEWATERING WELLS IN THE AREA OF GILCREST, 24 COLORADO, THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT AND FUNDING OF A GRANT 1 PROGRAM.

(b) THE EMERGENCY DEWATERING GRANT ACCOUNT, REFERRED TO
IN THIS SUBSECTION (10) AS THE "ACCOUNT", IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE
COLORADO WATER CONSERVATION BOARD CONSTRUCTION FUND. FOR THE
2015-16 AND 2016-17 FISCAL YEARS, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
TRANSFER TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL
FUND TO THE ACCOUNT FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EMERGENCY
DEWATERING GRANT PROGRAM CREATED IN THIS SUBSECTION (10).

9 (c) (I) THE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE STATE 10 ENGINEER, SHALL EXPEND MONEY FROM THE ACCOUNT TO AWARD GRANTS 11 FOR EMERGENCY PUMPING OF WELLS PERMITTED FOR DEWATERING WITHIN 12 OR NEAR GILCREST, COLORADO. THE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH 13 THE STATE ENGINEER, MAY AWARD GRANTS TO PUBLIC ENTITIES, PRIVATE 14 ENTITIES, AND PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS SEEKING TO IMPLEMENT EMERGENCY 15 PUMPING OF WELLS PERMITTED FOR DEWATERING. THE BOARD SHALL SEEK 16 INPUT FROM THE SOUTH PLATTE BASIN ROUNDTABLE, CREATED IN 17 SECTION 37-75-104 (3) (b) (I), AND THE ROUNDTABLE'S TECHNICAL 18 COMMITTEE ON THE GENERAL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH DEWATERING 19 WITHIN AND NEAR GILCREST, COLORADO, AND THE INFRASTRUCTURE 20 NEEDED TO IMPLEMENT THE DEWATERING PROJECT.

(II) THE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE STATE ENGINEER,
SHALL DEVELOP CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES FOR THE GRANT PROGRAM AND
THE ACCOMPANYING REAL-TIME DATA COLLECTION, INCLUDING
SELECTION CRITERIA AND GRANTEE REPORTING CRITERIA.

(III) THE BOARD MAY ACCEPT AND EXPEND GIFTS, GRANTS, AND
DONATIONS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (10), BUT THE
IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBSECTION (10) IS NOT DEPENDENT ON THE

1 RECEIPT OF GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. THE BOARD SHALL TRANSMIT 2 ALL MONEY RECEIVED THROUGH GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS TO THE 3 STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THEM TO THE ACCOUNT. 4 (IV) (A) ON AN ANNUAL BASIS, THE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION 5 WITH THE STATE ENGINEER, SHALL REPORT TO THE WATER RESOURCES 6 REVIEW COMMITTEE, CREATED IN SECTION 37-98-102, ON THE PROGRESS 7 OF THE GRANT PROGRAM. 8 ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2017, THE BOARD, IN **(B)** 9 COLLABORATION WITH THE STATE ENGINEER, SHALL PROVIDE THE WATER 10 RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE WITH A FINAL REPORT ON THE GRANT 11 PROGRAM. 12 (C) TO ASSIST WITH THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF THIS 13 SUBPARAGRAPH (IV), THE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE STATE 14 ENGINEER, SHALL DEVELOP REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANTEES. 15 (d) THIS SUBSECTION (10) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018. 16 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 17 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
