A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING OPIOID ANALGESICS WITH ABUSE-DETERRENT PROPERTIES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill prohibits an opioid analgesic drug product that is not abuse-deterrent to be substituted for an abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product if a health care provider prescribes an abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product to a patient and the prescription includes the instructions "dispense as written". A carrier must cover the abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product at the lowest cost-sharing

level as an opioid analgesic drug product. A carrier cannot require treatment failure with an opioid analgesic drug product that is not abuse-deterrent prior to providing coverage for the abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product if the prescribing health care provider determines that the covered person would benefit from the abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 10-16-124.7 as 3 follows: 4 10-16-124.7. Opioid analysics with abuse-deterrent properties 5 - study - definitions. (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DIRECT THE GOVERNOR'S 6 CONSORTIUM FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION TO STUDY THE 7 BARRIERS TO AND THE EFFICACY OF THE USE OF ABUSE-DETERRENT OPIOID 8 ANALGESIC DRUG PRODUCTS AS A WAY TO REDUCE ABUSE AND DIVERSION 9 OF OPIOID DRUG PRODUCTS. ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 15, 2016, THE 10 CONSORTIUM SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH CARE 11 AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE AND THE HEALTH, INSURANCE, AND 12 ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE 13 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, OR THEIR 14 SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES. 15 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION: "ABUSE-DETERRENT OPIOID ANALGESIC DRUG PRODUCT" 16 17 MEANS A BRAND OR GENERIC OPIOID ANALGESIC DRUG PRODUCT 18 APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION 19 WITH ABUSE-DETERRENCE LABELING CLAIMS THAT INDICATE THAT THE 20 DRUG PRODUCT IS EXPECTED TO RESULT IN A MEANINGFUL REDUCTION IN 21 ABUSE. 22

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1	(b) "Opioid analgesic drug product" means a drug product
2	IN THE OPIOID ANALGESIC DRUG CLASS PRESCRIBED TO TREAT MODERATE
3	TO SEVERE PAIN OR OTHER CONDITIONS, WHETHER IN IMMEDIATE RELEASE
4	OR EXTENDED RELEASE OR LONG-ACTING FORM, THAT MAY BE COMBINED
5	WITH OTHER DRUG SUBSTANCES TO FORM A SINGLE DRUG PRODUCT OR
6	DOSAGE FORM.
7	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
8	takes effect January 1, 2016; except that, if a referendum petition is filed
9	pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this
10	act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period
11	after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item,
12	section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the
13	general election to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take
14	effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the
15	governor.

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
