Legislative Council Staff agrees that the Fiscal Note dated 01/27/15 did not account for the fact that some of the costs and savings associated with this program will be built into the Long Bill for FY 2015-16, because the program sunsets pursuant to the provisions in Section 24-34-104, C.R.S., which allow for a one-year wind down period. Also, the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) needs to be updated for more recent information. The average Medicaid FMAP for state FY 2015-16 will be 50.79 percent.

Overall, the reauthorization/expansion of the program is still expected to reduce General Fund expenditures, but for FY 2015-16 the incremental difference from the appropriations in the Long Bill will be a slight increase in General Fund expenditures.

Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision adjusting the Long Bill for FY 2015-16 to increase total funds by \$2,300,100 for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, including an increase of \$36,144 General Fund, a decrease of \$30,026 cash funds from certified public expenditures, and an increase of \$2,293,982 federal funds.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The general appropriations bill for FY 2015-16 has not yet been introduced. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$36,144 for FY 2015-16, reducing the amount of General Fund available for other existing programs.
