Summary of Legislation

The bill appropriates \$5,580,000 from the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Construction Fund for specific water-related projects in FY 2015-16. The bill also authorizes:

- five cash fund transfers totaling up to \$3,400,000 in FY 2015-16;
- extending the Stream Restoration Grant Account until July 1, 2017; and
- accounting for variation in the amount of money loaned for the Chatfield Reallocation Project.

Background

The CWCB Construction Fund was created in 1971 to provide low-interest loans for water projects. Revenue for this revolving loan fund comes from interest earned on outstanding loans and the fund's cash balance and royalty distributions from federal mineral leases.

Based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff economic forecast, and including the three severance tax transfers from this bill, proportional reductions to Tier II programs are not anticipated in either FY 2015-16 or FY 2016-17.

State Revenue

State transfers. This bill transfers up to \$3,400,000 as follows:

- Up to \$500,000 from the CWCB Construction Fund to restore the unencumbered balance of the Flood and Drought Response Fund for responding to flood and drought events:
- \$200,000 from the CWCB Construction Fund to restore the unencumbered balance to the Litigation Fund to continue litigation support for the CWCB;
- \$1,200,000 from the Severance Tax Operational Fund to the CWCB Construction Fund for the Development of Modern Tools for Determining Large Rain Events for Regulating and Designing Dam Spillways;
- \$1,000,000 from the Severance Tax Operational Fund to the CWCB Construction Fund for the Watershed Restoration Program; and
- \$500,000 from the Severance Tax Perpetual Base Fund to the CWCB Construction Fund to continue the Watershed Restoration Program.

State Expenditures

The bill expends \$5,580,000 in FY 2015-16 from the CWCB Construction Fund. The projects for which moneys are appropriated are shown in Table 1.

State Appropriations

For FY 2015-16, the Department of Natural Resources requires an appropriation of \$5,580,000 from the CWCB Construction Fund.
