Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriations clause that:

- Appropriates \$8,910,000 General Fund in FY 2015-16 to the Southwest Chief Rail Line Economic Development, Rural Tourism, and Infrastructure Repair and Maintenance Fund (Fund); and
- Reappropriates the \$8,910,000 from the Fund to the Department of Transportation for use by the Southwest Chief Rail Line Economic Development, Rural Tourism, and Infrastructure Repair and Maintenance Commission.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

L.002 Bill Sponsor amendment L.002 (attached) eliminates the appropriation clause in the bill. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that this amendment eliminates the fiscal impact of the bill.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
