# **Summary of Legislation**

The bill allows a speech-language pathologist to obtain a provisional certification prior to the completion of a clinical fellowship. To obtain the provisional certification, the applicant must have first completed the educational requirements and passed a national competency examination. A holder of a provisional certification must practice under the supervision of a fully certified speech-language pathologist. Provisional certification expires after 24 months or upon issuance of full certification, whichever comes first. A provisional license cannot be renewed.

#### **State Revenue**

The bill increase revenue to the Department of Regulatory Agencies by up to \$1,500 per year beginning in FY 2015-16, deposited in the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund. Given the minimal costs to implement the bill, it is assumed that a nominal fee up to \$20 will be charged to applicants seeking provisional certification. It is projected that about 75 applicants per year will seek provisional speech-language pathologist certification.

#### **TABOR Impact**

This bill increases state revenue from fees, which will increase the amount required to be refunded under TABOR. TABOR refunds are paid from the General Fund.

# **State Expenditures**

The bill will increase workload in the Department of Regulatory Agencies by a minimal amount to establish the provisional certification of speech-language pathologists. Staff time will be required to set program rules, procedures, and forms, as well as to respond to public complaints related to provisionally certified speech-language pathologists. Given that the new provisional certification represents a relatively small change to the existing certification program, it is expected to have a minimal impact on agency workload. Thus, no change in appropriations is required.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
