#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS NECESSARY TO QUALIFY

102 FOR A LICENSE TO TAKE WILDLIFE.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, a person has to obtain a hunter education certificate to be issued a license to hunt in Colorado. To get the certificate, the person needs to take a 10-hour hunter education course. The commission may create various ways to meet this requirement, including testing out of it or getting an apprentice certificate. A veteran may obtain a certificate without taking the course if the veteran passes a test. If the division

verifies a person's certificate, the person need not carry the certificate while hunting. The bill eliminates the requirement that the hunter education course consist of 10 hours of instruction.

The bill also creates an apprentice program that allows a person who is at least 10 years of age to be issued a temporary certificate without hunter education if he or she is accompanied by a mentor who is at least 18 years of age and meets the certification requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-6-107, **amend** (8); and **add** (10) as follows:

33-6-107. Licensing violations - penalties - rule. (8) (a) UNLESS OTHERWISE PERMITTED BY COMMISSION RULE, it is unlawful for any person born on or after January 1, 1949, to purchase or obtain any hunting license, hunt, or trap unless the person produces HAS BEEN ISSUED a hunter education certificate issued by the division, attesting to the person's successful completion of a division-certified hunter education course taught by a division-certified instructor which totals not less than ten hours of instruction OR EQUIVALENT EDUCATION AND TRAINING RECOGNIZED BY THE DIVISION UNDER PARAGRAPH (b), (c), OR (e) OF THIS SUBSECTION (8) OR SUBSECTION (10) OF THIS SECTION.

- (b) IN ORDER TO INCREASE HUNTER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION, THE COMMISSION MAY PROMULGATE A RULE ESTABLISHING ALTERNATIVE REQUIREMENTS TO OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF HUNTER EDUCATION. THE ALTERNATIVES MAY INCLUDE: OPTIONS TO DEMONSTRATE KNOWLEDGE OF HUNTING, SAFETY, AND ETHICS; COURSE DELIVERY OPTIONS; ISSUING TEMPORARY OR APPRENTICE CERTIFICATES OF HUNTER EDUCATION; AND AN OPTION TO TEST OUT OF THE HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE.
  - (c) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROMULGATE A RULE ALLOWING

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1	VETERANS, INCLUDING <u>ACTIVE-DUTY</u> , <u>RESERVE-DUTY</u> , <u>OR NATIONAL</u>
2	GUARD PERSONNEL, TO OBTAIN A HUNTER EDUCATION CERTIFICATE
3	WITHOUT ATTENDING A HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE IF THE VETERAN
4	SUCCESSFULLY PASSES A TEST-OUT OPTION AS DEVELOPED BY THE
5	COMMISSION. TO QUALIFY, A VETERAN MUST BE DISCHARGED UNDER
6	HONORABLE CONDITIONS.
7	(d) Unless the certificate of hunter education has been
8	VERIFIED BY THE DIVISION, any person required to obtain such a certificate
9	OF HUNTER EDUCATION shall have the certificate on his or her person
10	while hunting, trapping, or taking wildlife.
11	(e) For the purposes of this subsection (8), the division shall
12	recognize, in addition to Colorado hunter education certificates issued on
13	or after January 1, 1985, those Colorado hunter education certificates
14	issued prior to BEFORE January 1, 1985, and any valid temporary hunter
15	education certificate issued by the division, and the division may
16	recognize the hunter education programs of OR CERTIFICATES OF other
17	states or countries as being sufficient for the purposes of purchasing a
18	hunting license in Colorado.
19	(f) Any person who violates this subsection (8) OR ANY RULE
20	IMPLEMENTING THIS SUBSECTION (8) is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
21	conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of fifty dollars and an
22	assessment of ten license suspension points.
23	(10) (a) THE DIVISION MAY ISSUE AN APPRENTICE CERTIFICATE OF
24	HUNTER EDUCATION TO A PERSON WHO:
25	(I) Is at least ten years of age;
26	(II) IS BEING TAUGHT TO HUNT BY A MENTOR WHO IS EIGHTEEN

YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AND WHO HOLDS A VALID HUNTER EDUCATION

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1	CERTIFICATE OR WHO WAS BORN BEFORE JANUARY 1, 1949; AND
2	(III) COMPLIES WITH ANY REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY RULE
3	OF THE COMMISSION.
4	(b) WHILE HUNTING, A PERSON ISSUED AN APPRENTICE
5	CERTIFICATE OF HUNTER EDUCATION SHALL BE PERSONALLY
6	ACCOMPANIED BY, IN VOICE CONTACT WITH, AND IN VISUAL CONTACT
7	WITH A MENTOR WHO IS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AND WHO
8	HOLDS A VALID HUNTER EDUCATION CERTIFICATE OR WHO WAS BORN
9	BEFORE JANUARY 1, 1949.
10	(c) AN APPRENTICE CERTIFICATE OF HUNTER EDUCATION:
11	(I) MAY BE USED IN LIEU OF A CERTIFICATE OF HUNTER EDUCATION
12	ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (8) OF THIS SECTION TO PURCHASE OR OBTAIN
13	A LICENSE TO TAKE WILDLIFE; AND
14	(II) IS VALID FOR NO MORE THAN ONE YEAR AFTER ISSUANCE.
15	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
16	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
17	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
18	5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a
19	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
20	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
21	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
22	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
23	November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
24	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
