Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides the following appropriations from the newly created Proposition AA Refund Account in the General Fund for FY 2015-16 if voters approve the ballot question allowing the State to retain the revenue identified to be returned to the voters and total \$12.0 million:

^{*}This appropriation clause also authorizes the Department of Education to spend \$2,000,000 reappropriated funds from the Student Re-engagement Grant Program Fund, and authorizes the Department of Human Services to spend \$1,000,000 reappropriated funds from the Youth Mentoring Services Cash Fund in FY 2015-16.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$212,369 to the Department of Local Affairs and \$25,440 to the Department of Revenue for FY 2015-16, from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Local Affairs will require an additional 2.0 FTE. Further, the provision appropriates \$79,770 from the Department of Local Affairs to the Governor's Office of Information Technology.

L.001 Bill Sponsor amendment **L.001** (attached) accomplishes four changes to the bill:

- It eliminates the reduction to the local shareback;
- Provides the Department of Revenue with a manner to directly account for the reduced distributions to local governments for General Fund set aside for the refund;
- Provides the Department of Revenue with sufficient time to certify special sales tax receipts before completing the special sales tax portion of the refund; and
- Clarifies the timing of the actions required to recoup \$30.3 million General Fund that is transferred to the Proposition AA Refund Account.

Whether or not L.001 is adopted, the Committee should adopt J.001.

Points to Consider

Technical Issue

Amendment **J.001** includes an appropriation of \$212,369 and 2.0 FTE for the Department of Local Affairs to administer the newly created Local Government Retail Marijuana Impact Grant Program. The bill authorizes the General Assembly to appropriate moneys from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Department of Local Affairs to provide grants to local governments impacted by marijuana regulation. The bill appropriates \$1,000,000 for the first round of grant funding to the Department

of Local Affairs if voters allow the state to retain the moneys in the Proposition AA Refund Account of the General Fund. If voters reject the ballot initiative, **J.001** will provide funding for a grant program with no funding to provide grants.
