### BILL TOPIC: NO CONTACT WITH DEFENSE-INITIATED VICTIM OUTREACH

## Summary of Legislation

This bill specifies parameters for defense-initiated contact with the family members of a victim or witnesses in any case involving a class 1 felony. Under the bill, a court must mail a written explanation if it has authorized expenditures for a defense-initiated victim outreach (DIVO) specialist. An immediate family member or witness also has the right to not be contacted by the specialist unless he or she has provided consent.

# **State Expenditures**

This bill is anticipated to increase workload for the district trial courts within the Judicial Department by a minimal amount to provide notices to victim family members and witnesses in cases where the court has authorized a DIVO specialist. On average there are about 120 cases each year that involve a class 1 felony. In cases where the defendant is represented by the Office of the State Public Defender or Office of the Alternate Defense Counsel, the bill may also reduce state expenditures by limiting the number of persons the DIVO specialist has contact with. As of this writing, it is not known how many cases per year include a DIVO specialist. However, the fiscal note assumes that due to the low number of total cases involving a class 1 felony, these impacts are minimal and do not require an adjustment in appropriations.

### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect August 5, 2015, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2015, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
