## Description of Amendments in This Packet

J. 001 Staff has prepared amendment J. 001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of $\$ 37,138$ General Fund to the Department of Human Services for FY 2015-16. Of these funds $\$ 16,600$ if for use by the Office of Information Technology Services for Trails system enhancements; and $\$ 20,538$ is based on the assumption that the Division of Child Welfare will require an additional 0.4 FTE to monitor Trails usage by local agencies.

## Points to Consider

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full $\$ 18.5$ million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
