A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE PREVENTION OF MULTIPLE VOTER REGISTRATIONS**
102 **BY THE SAME ELECTOR.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In an effort to eliminate multiple voter registrations by the same elector, the bill permits the secretary of state to forward any information obtained from the division of motor vehicles in the department of revenue to the appropriate county clerk and recorder who shall then update an elector's voter registration record in the master list of registered electors.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-2-302, **add** (6.8)
3 as follows:

4 **1-2-302. Maintenance of computerized statewide voter**
5 **registration list - confidentiality.** (6.8) IN ACCORDANCE WITH
6 SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY OF STATE MAY
7 FORWARD ANY INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM THE DIVISION OF MOTOR
8 VEHICLES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY
9 CLERK AND RECORDER. IF THE INFORMATION MEETS THE MINIMUM
10 MATCHING CRITERIA AS SPECIFIED IN SECTIONS 1-2-603 AND 1-2-604, THE
11 CLERK SHALL THEN UPDATE THE ELECTOR'S VOTER REGISTRATION RECORD
12 IN THE MASTER LIST OF REGISTERED ELECTORS.

13 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
14 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
15 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
16 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a
17 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
18 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
19 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
20 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
21 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
