Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$125,983 General Fund to the Office of the Governor for FY 2015-16. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Office will require an additional 1.0 FTE. The moneys are intended to be used by the Office of Economic Development and International Trade to support the Colorado Economic Development Commission in implementing the Rural Jump-Start Zone program created with this bill.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$19.7 million General Fund for 2015 legislation, including \$18.5 million to be available for appropriations

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plus \$1.2 million for the associated 6.5 percent statutory reserve. If this amount is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
