A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING AN EXCEPTION TO THE PROHIBITION AGAINST PAYING POSTEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FOR THE DENVER HEALTH

103 AND HOSPITAL AUTHORITY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, a governmental unit is generally prohibited from paying postemployment compensation to a government-supported official or employee after that individual's employment has ended. The University of Colorado hospital is specifically excepted from this prohibition because it is excluded from the definition of "governmental unit."

The bill also excludes the Denver health and hospital authority from the definition of "governmental unit", thereby extending the same exception to the authority.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-19-102, amend 3 (3) (b) as follows: 4 **24-19-102. Definitions.** For the purposes of this article, unless the 5 context otherwise requires: 6 (3) (b) "Governmental unit" does not include the university of 7 Colorado hospital authority created pursuant to section 23-21-503, 8 C.R.S., OR THE DENVER HEALTH AND HOSPITAL AUTHORITY CREATED IN 9 SECTION 25-29-103, C.R.S. 10 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 11 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 12 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly 13 (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, 14 if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of 15 the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 16 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 17 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 18 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 19 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
