1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 39-22-2402 3 as follows: 4 39-22-2402. Voluntary contribution designation - procedure. 5 For income tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2008, but prior 6 to January 1, 2016 JANUARY 1, 2021, the Colorado state individual 7 income tax return form shall contain a line whereby each individual 8 taxpayer may designate the amount of the contribution, if any, the 9 individual wishes to make to the Colorado healthy rivers fund created in 10 section 39-22-2403. 11 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 12 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 13 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 14 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a 15 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 16 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 17 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 18 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 19 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 20 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
