	WHEREAS, Delays in public decision-making regarding broadband policies jeopardize private investment in broadband, causing	
	uncertainty in providing competitive broadband alternatives to Coloradans; and

9 10	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventieth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
11 12 13 14	(1) That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly, urge state and local governments to enact appropriate policies to remove barriers to broadband and video competition, allowing for more private investment in broadband networks to flow into the state; and
15 16	(2) That further legislation to remove outdated regulations may be needed in order to accomplish this goal.
