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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING THE EXPANSION OF THE "COLORADO COTTAGE FOODS**  
102 **ACT," AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, INCREASING THE NET**  
103 **REVENUE A PRODUCER CAN EARN UNDER THE ACT.**

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**Bill Summary**

The bill increases the amount of net revenue a producer selling under the "Colorado Cottage Foods Act" may earn per eligible product from \$5,000 to \$20,000 each calendar year. The bill defines "small business" and allows producers to sell products directly to small businesses for resale.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

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3           SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1614, **amend**  
4 (2) (e) as follows:

5           **25-4-1614. Home kitchens - exemption - food inspection - short**  
6 **title - definitions.** (2) (e) This section applies only to producers who  
7 earn net revenues of five TEN thousand dollars or less per calendar year  
8 from the sale of each eligible food product produced in the producer's  
9 home kitchen or a commercial, private, or public kitchen.

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11           SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-16-103, **amend**  
12 (4) (b) (II) as follows:

13           **12-16-103. Definitions - rules.** As used in this part 1, unless the  
14 context otherwise requires:

15           (4) (b) "Dealer" does not include:

16           (II) A producer under the "Colorado Cottage Foods Act", section  
17 25-4-1614 (9) (c), C.R.S., who earns net revenues of ~~five~~ TEN thousand  
18 dollars or less per calendar year from the sale of each eligible food  
19 product. ~~on the person's premises, at the person's roadside stand, at a~~  
20 ~~farmers' market or community-supported agriculture organization, or in~~

22           SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-16-202, **amend**  
23 (4.5) (b) (II) as follows:

24           **12-16-202. Definitions - rules.** As used in this part 2, unless the  
25 context otherwise requires:

26           (4.5) (b) "Commodity handler" does not include:

7 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date -**  
8 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following  
9 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the  
10 general assembly (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6,  
11 2015); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1  
12 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,  
13 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part  
14 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election  
15 to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the  
16 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

17 (2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable  
18 effective date of this act.
