### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING THE USE OF AN OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE TO CROSS A

102 ROADWAY.

#### **Bill Summary**

Currently, off-highway vehicles may cross streets, roads, or highways if the driver complies with certain snowmobile statutory standards. The bill imports the snowmobile standards into the off-highway vehicle statutes. The bill also clarifies that a driver may cross a state highway if the driver complies with these standards.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-14.5-108, amend
3	(1) (b) as follows:
4	33-14.5-108. Off-highway vehicle operation prohibited on
5	streets, roads, and highways. (1) No off-highway vehicle may be
6	operated on the public streets, roads, or highways of this state except in
7	the following cases:
8	(b) When crossing streets or when crossing roads, highways, or
9	railroad tracks in the manner provided in ACCORDANCE WITH section
10	<del>33-14-112</del> 33-14.5-108.5;
11	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 33-14.5-108.5
12	as follows:
13	33-14.5-108.5. Crossing roads, highways, and railroad tracks.
14	(1) THE DRIVER OF AN OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE MAY DIRECTLY CROSS A
15	ROADWAY, INCLUDING A STATE HIGHWAY, AT AN AT-GRADE CROSSING TO
16	CONTINUE USING THE OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE ON THE OTHER SIDE.
17	(2) A PERSON SHALL NOT CROSS A HIGHWAY WHILE DRIVING AN
18	OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE UNLESS THE CROSSING IS MADE IN ACCORDANCE
19	WITH THE FOLLOWING:
20	(a) The crossing must be made at an angle of
21	APPROXIMATELY NINETY DEGREES TO THE DIRECTION OF THE HIGHWAY
22	AND AT A PLACE WHERE NO OBSTRUCTION PREVENTS A QUICK AND SAFE
23	CROSSING.
24	(b) THE OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE MUST BE BROUGHT TO A COMPLETE
25	STOP BEFORE CROSSING THE SHOULDER OR, IF NONE, THE ROADWAY
26	BEFORE PROCEEDING.

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(c) THE DRIVER MUST YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO ALL MOTOR
 VEHICLE TRAFFIC ON THE ROADWAY THAT CONSTITUTES AN IMMEDIATE
 HAZARD TO THE CROSSING.

4 (d) A DRIVER OF AN OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE MUST CROSS A
5 DIVIDED HIGHWAY AT AN INTERSECTION OF THE HIGHWAY WITH ANOTHER
6 ROAD OR HIGHWAY.

7 (3) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A CLASS
8 2 PETTY OFFENSE AND, UPON CONVICTION, SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE
9 OF FIFTY DOLLARS.

10 SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date -11 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following 12 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the 13 general assembly (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 14 2015); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 15 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, 16 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part 17 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election 18 to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor. 19

20 (2) This act applies to offenses committed on or after the21 applicable effective date of this act.

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
