Joint Budget Committee. The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$2,059,079 from the intellectual and developmental disabilities services cash fund to the general fund on April 1, 2015.

4 25.5-10-207. Services and supports - waiting list reduction 5 cash fund - repeal. (6) (a) ON APRIL 1, 2015, THE STATE TREASURER
6 SHALL TRANSFER TWO MILLION FIFTY-NINE THOUSAND SEVENTY-NINE
7 DOLLARS FROM THE INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
8 SERVICES CASH FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND.

9 (b) This subsection (6) is repealed, effective July 1, 2016.
