A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE USE OF EARPHONES WHILE DRIVING.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Current law prohibits the use of earphones when driving. The bill exempts from the definition of "earphones" a headset that covers only one ear and that is used with a hand-held telephone.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1411, amend
2	(1) (b); and add (3) as follows:
3	42-4-1411. Use of earphones while driving. (1) (b) For purposes
4	of this subsection (1), "earphones" includes any headset, radio, tape
5	player, or other similar device which provides the listener with radio
6	programs, music, or other recorded information through a device attached
7	to the head and which covers all of or a portion of the ears. "Earphones"
8	does not include speakers or other listening devices which THAT are built
9	into protective headgear OR A DEVICE OR PORTION OF A DEVICE THAT
10	ONLY COVERS ALL OR A PORTION OF ONE EAR AND THAT IS CONNECTED TO
11	A WIRELESS, HAND-HELD TELEPHONE.
12	(3) Nothing in this section authorizes the holder of a
13	COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUED PURSUANT TO PART 4 OF ARTICLE
14	2 OF THIS TITLE TO ACT IN VIOLATION OF ANY FEDERAL LAW OR
15	REGULATION RELATING TO DRIVING A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE.
16	SECTION 2. Applicability. This act applies to offenses
17	committed on or after the effective date of this act.
18	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
