**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 15-016**

101 **CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF "SINGLE PARENTS' DAY".**

1           WHEREAS, Parents must invest immeasurable amounts of time,  
2 energy, and devotion when raising their children in order to provide them  
3 with the love, support, and guidance required to become responsible,  
4 productive, and successful adults; and

5           WHEREAS, The responsibility of raising children in today's  
6 society is particularly difficult when it falls on the shoulders of a single  
7 parent; and

8           WHEREAS, The number of single-parent families has more than  
9 doubled in the past 25 years; and

10           WHEREAS, More than 20 million children in this country  
11 currently live in single-parent homes; and

1           WHEREAS, The greatest need of every child is to be loved,  
2 whether the child lives in a single-parent or two-parent family; and

3           WHEREAS, The dedication and achievement of single parents  
4 deserve our recognition; and

5           WHEREAS, In 1984, Congress passed House Joint Resolution 200  
6 (Public Law 98-240), which designated March 21, 1984, as "National  
7 Single Parent Day", and President Reagan issued Proclamation 5166,  
8 which proclaimed March 21, 1984, "National Single Parent Day". Since  
9 then, many states and organizations across the country recognize March  
10 21 each year as "Single Parents' Day"; and

11           WHEREAS, In 1993, Colorado became the first state to sign a  
12 proclamation officially recognizing March 21 as "Single Parents' Day";  
13 now, therefore,

14           *Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventieth General Assembly*  
15 *of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:*

16           That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly,  
17 designate March 21, 2015, as "Single Parents' Day" in Colorado in  
18 recognition of the dedication and achievements of all single parents.

19           *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent  
20 to Janice S. Moglen of the Coalition for Single Parents' Day.
