25 REVIEW THE UTILIZATION OF FLEX USE CHANGE-IN-USE DECREES,
26 PERMITTED UNDER SECTION 37-92-305 (3.7), AND SUBSTITUTE WATER
27 SUPPLY PLANS APPROVING FLEX USE, PERMITTED UNDER SECTION
28 37-92-308 (12).

29 (b) THE BOARD, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE ENGINEER,
30 SHALL DETERMINE THE EXTENT TO WHICH FLEX USE IS BEING UTILIZED,
31 THE MANNER IN WHICH IT IS BEING UTILIZED, AND ANY ISSUES ARISING
32 FROM ITS UTILIZATION.

33 (c) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2016, AND ANNUALLY
34 THEREAFTER, THE BOARD SHALL REPORT ON THE UTILIZATION OF FLEX USE
35 TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE CREATED IN SECTION
36 37-98-102 OR ITS SUCCESSOR COMMITTEE. THE BOARD SHALL PROVIDE A
37 FINAL REPORT TO THE WATER RESOURCES REVIEW COMMITTEE ON OR
38 BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2025.

39 (d) THIS SUBSECTION (10) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026."

46 money judgment pursuant to subsection (1) of this section and if no civil
47 actions are pending under this section after ~~five~~ THREE years from the
48 establishment of an escrow account, the board shall notify the department
49 of corrections of the existence of such escrow account. The department
50 of corrections shall certify to the board a statement of the costs of
51 maintenance of the person in the state correctional institution or
52 institutions at which the person was incarcerated. A statement of the cost
53 of maintenance shall be submitted annually for payment to the
54 department of corrections by the board until such time as the person is
55 released from custody of the state. No such payment shall be made upon
56 the dismissal of the charges against any individual whose proceeds are

1 placed in the escrow account.

2 (3) Upon the dismissal of the charges against any individual
3 whose proceeds are placed in the escrow account or upon a showing by
4 the defendant that ~~five~~ THREE years have elapsed from the establishment
5 of an escrow account and that no civil actions are pending against him or
6 her under this section, the board shall immediately pay any money in the
7 escrow account to the defendant except for funds paid to the department
8 of corrections and anticipated as necessary for future payment to the
9 department of corrections as set forth in subsection (2) of this section.

10 (4) If an escrow account is established under this section, no
11 otherwise applicable statute of limitations on the time within which civil
12 action may be brought bars action by a victim of a crime committed by
13 the person accused or convicted of the crime, as to a claim resulting from
14 the crime, until ~~five~~ THREE years have elapsed from the time the escrow
15 account was established.

16 (4.5) The escrow account shall be established for a period of ~~five~~
17 THREE years. If an action is filed by a victim to recover the victim's
18 interest in the escrow account within such ~~five-year~~ THREE-YEAR period,
19 the escrow account shall continue until the conclusion of such action."
