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39 **"SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general
40 assembly finds and declares that:

41 (a) Under current law, most sales and uses of dyed diesel fuel are
42 exempt from the state sales and use tax;

43 (b) In a limited number of circumstances, dyed diesel is used in

1 a manner for which it is not exempt from the state sales and use tax; for
2 example, if it is used to power a hospital generator or a semitrailer's cabin
3 auxiliary power unit;
4 (c) These nonexempt uses generate an insignificant amount of
5 revenue; and
6 (d) The different tax treatment of dyed diesel based on its use
7 creates an administrative burden for retailers.
8 (2) Now, therefore, the general assembly declares that the
9 intended purpose of the tax exemption created in this act is to streamline
10 the collection of sales and use taxes by treating all dyed diesel the same.".
