51 **23-7-103. Presumptions and rules for determination of status.**

52 (1) Unless the contrary appears to the satisfaction of the registering
53 authority of the institution at which a student is registering, it shall be
54 presumed that:

55 (c) (I) (C) A dependent of a member of the armed forces is
56 eligible for in-state tuition classification when the member moves to

1 Colorado on a permanent change-of-station basis, regardless of the length
2 of the member's or dependent's residency in Colorado. After qualifying
3 as an in-state student, a member of the armed forces of the United States
4 on active duty, or the member's dependent, shall not lose his or her
5 eligibility for in-state tuition status if the member retires or separates from
6 the military. As used in this sub-subparagraph (C), "dependent" means a
7 spouse of a member of the armed services who was the member's spouse
8 at the time that the member was stationed in Colorado and at the time the
9 spouse is requesting in-state tuition classification and any child under
10 ~~twenty-two~~ TWENTY-THREE years of age born to or legally adopted by the
11 member of the armed forces who enrolls in a public institution of higher
12 education within ~~ten~~ TWELVE years after the member was stationed in
13 Colorado."
