- (III)A PEACE OFFICER INTERRUPTS THE PERSON'S LAWFUL ATTEMPT TO RECORD AN INCIDENT INVOLVING A PEACE OFFICER;
- (IV) A PEACE OFFICER RETALIATES AGAINST A PERSON FOR RECORDING OR ATTEMPTING TO RECORD AN INCIDENT INVOLVING A PEACE OFFICER; OR
- (V) A PEACE OFFICER REFUSES TO RETURN THE PERSON'S RECORDING DEVICE THAT CONTAINS A RECORDING OF A PEACE OFFICER-INVOLVED INCIDENT WITHIN A REASONABLE TIME PERIOD AND WITHOUT LEGAL JUSTIFICATION.
- (b) IN THE ACTION, THE PERSON WHO RECORDED OR ATTEMPTED TO RECORD THE PEACE OFFICER-INVOLVED INCIDENT IS ENTITLED TO ACTUAL DAMAGES, DAMAGES FOR NONECONOMIC LOSS OR INJURY OF UP TO FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS, AND ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS.
- (2) AN ACTION BROUGHT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION DOES NOT PRECLUDE THE PERSON FROM SEEKING THAT CRIMINAL CHARGES BE FILED AGAINST A PEACE OFFICER FOR TAMPERING WITH PHYSICAL EVIDENCE IN VIOLATION OF SECTION 18-8-610, C.R.S., OR ANY OTHER CRIME.

- (b) IF THE PERSON CONSENTS TO THE VOLUNTARILY TRANSFER OF 19 THE DEVICE TO LAW ENFORCEMENT, THE PEACE OFFICER SHALL LIMIT HIS OR HER SEARCH OF THE DEVICE TO A SEARCH FOR THE RECORDING THAT IS RELEVANT EVIDENCE TO THE INVESTIGATION, AND THE DEVICE SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE PERSON UPON REQUEST AND WITH ALL CONVENIENT SPEED.
