33 CHILDREN UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE, AND OTHER PROVISIONS AS MAY BE  
34 ESTABLISHED BY THE DIRECTOR BY RULE. THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR  
35 AND THE LICENSED PHYSICIAN SHALL KEEP THE WRITTEN COLLABORATIVE  
36 AGREEMENT ON FILE AND, UPON REQUEST BY THE DIRECTOR, FOR  
37 NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS, OR BY COLORADO MEDICAL BOARD, FOR

49 (D) NOTHING IN THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (III): LIMITS THE ABILITY OF  
50 A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR TO MAKE AN INDEPENDENT JUDGMENT;  
51 REQUIRES SUPERVISION BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN; PRECLUDES THE USE OF  
52 PROFESSIONAL JUDGMENT OR VARIATION ACCORDING TO THE NEEDS OF  
53 THE CHILD UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE; IMPOSES LIABILITY ON A LICENSED  
54 PHYSICIAN, IN DEVELOPING OR SIGNING A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT,  
55 FOR THE ACTIONS OF THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IN TREATING A CHILD  
56 UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE; IMPOSES LIABILITY ON A NATUROPATHIC

1 DOCTOR, IN DEVELOPING OR SIGNING A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT, FOR  
2 THE ACTIONS OF THE LICENSED PHYSICIAN IN CONSULTING REGARDING THE  
3 TREATMENT OF A CHILD LESS THAN TWO YEARS OF AGE; OR REQUIRES THE  
4 NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR AND LICENSED PHYSICIAN TO BE PRACTICING IN  
5 THE SAME COMMUNITY OR IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO EACH OTHER IN ORDER  
6 TO ENTER INTO A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT;".

36 DOCTORS REGARDING THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN UNDER TWO YEARS OF  
37 AGE THAT NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS TREATED, THE CONDITIONS FOR  
38 WHICH NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS TREATED CHILDREN UNDER TWO YEARS  
39 OF AGE, AND THE NUMBER AND DESCRIPTION OF ANY ADVERSE EVENTS  
40 THAT OCCURRED IN CONNECTION WITH TREATING CHILDREN UNDER TWO  
41 YEARS OF AGE. ADDITIONALLY, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW  
42 WRITTEN COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENTS KEPT ON FILE BY NATUROPATHIC  
43 DOCTORS PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-37.3-105 (2) (e) (III) AND INCLUDE  
44 A SUMMARY OF THOSE AGREEMENTS IN ITS REPORT.

45 (b) AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION (2), "ADVERSE EVENT" MEANS  
46 ANY HARM TO A CHILD UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE THAT THE TREATING  
47 NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IS AWARE OF AND THAT RESULTED OR LIKELY  
48 RESULTED FROM THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR'S CARE OF THE CHILD.  
49 REPORTING AN ADVERSE EVENT TO THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THIS  
50 SECTION DOES NOT, ALONE, CONSTITUTE GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE  
51 PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-37.3-112."

 24 MINOR, ANONYMOUSLY OR OTHERWISE, BY TELEPHONE, TELEPHONE  
 25 NETWORK, DATA NETWORK, TEXT MESSAGE, INSTANT MESSAGE,  
 26 COMPUTER, COMPUTER NETWORK, COMPUTER SYSTEM, OR OTHER  
 27 INTERACTIVE ELECTRONIC MEDIUM IN A MANNER INTENDED TO HARASS OR  
 28 THREATEN BODILY INJURY OR PROPERTY DAMAGE, OR MAKES ANY  
 29 COMMENT, REQUEST, SUGGESTION, OR PROPOSAL BY TELEPHONE,  
 30 COMPUTER, COMPUTER NETWORK, COMPUTER SYSTEM, OR OTHER  
 31 INTERACTIVE ELECTRONIC MEDIUM THAT IS OBSCENE.

32 (2) HARASSMENT OF A MINOR PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF  
 33 THIS SECTION IS A CLASS 3 MISDEMEANOR; EXCEPT THAT HARASSMENT IS  
 34 A CLASS 1 MISDEMEANOR IF THE OFFENDER COMMITS HARASSMENT  
 35 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION WITH THE INTENT TO  
 36 INTIMIDATE OR HARASS ANOTHER PERSON BECAUSE OF THAT PERSON'S  
 37 ACTUAL OR PERCEIVED RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, ANCESTRY, OR NATIONAL  
 38 ORIGIN.

39 (3) ANY ACT PROHIBITED BY SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION MAY  
 40 BE DEEMED TO HAVE OCCURRED OR TO HAVE BEEN COMMITTED AT THE  
 41 PLACE AT WHICH THE TELEPHONE CALL, ELECTRONIC MAIL, OR OTHER  
 42 ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION WAS EITHER MADE OR RECEIVED.

43 (4) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE  
 44 REQUIRES:

45 (a) "MINOR" MEANS A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN.

46 (b) "OBSCENE" MEANS A PATENTLY OFFENSIVE DESCRIPTION OF  
 47 ULTIMATE SEXUAL ACTS OR SOLICITATION TO COMMIT ULTIMATE SEXUAL  
 48 ACTS, WHETHER OR NOT SAID ULTIMATE SEXUAL ACTS ARE NORMAL OR  
 49 PERVERTED, ACTUAL OR SIMULATED, INCLUDING MASTURBATION,  
 50 CUNNILINGUS, FELLATIO, ANILINGUS, OR EXCRETORY FUNCTIONS."
