THE INMATE LOCATOR ON THE INTERNET WEB SITE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS CAN ASSIST WITH THE COMPUTATION OF TIME RELATING TO THE SENTENCE OF AN INDIVIDUAL DEFENDANT."

- (III) THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE SHALL PREPARE a victim impact statement. shall be prepared by the district attorney's office on and after September 1, 1985. - (A) THE DEFENDANT IS A SEX OFFENDER FOR WHOM THE SEX OFFENDER MANAGEMENT BOARD HAS ESTABLISHED SEPARATE AND DISTINCT RELEASE GUIDELINES PURSUANT TO SECTION 18-1.3-1009, C.R.S.;
- (B) THE DEFENDANT HAS AT LEAST ONE PREVIOUS CONVICTION FOR A CRIME OF VIOLENCE AND MUST BE REFERRED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO THE STATE BOARD OF PAROLE PURSUANT TO SECTION 17-22.5-403 (3.5), C.R.S.;
- (C) THE DEFENDANT IS CONVICTED OF A CLASS 1 FELONY OR IS A JUVENILE CONVICTED AS AN ADULT OF A CLASS 1 FELONY; OR
- (D) THE PROBATION DEPARTMENT HAS REASONABLE GROUNDS TO 19 BELIEVE THAT THE LANGUAGE OF THE STATEMENT IS INAPPLICABLE TO THE 20 DEFENDANT. IF THE PROBATION DEPARTMENT ELECTS TO OMIT THE STATEMENT PURSUANT TO THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (D), THE PROBATION 22 DEPARTMENT SHALL DOCUMENT ITS GROUNDS FOR DOING SO.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a 28 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.".
