Amend printed bill, page 13, strike lines 12 through 16 and substitute "district and at least one-half of any increase in the appropriation for the program for the 2009-10 fiscal year to applicants that provide services and supports that are designed to reduce the number of truancy cases requiring ADMINISTRATIVE LAW court involvement and that also reflect the best interests of students and families. The services and supports shall include, but need".
