(b) (II) as enacted by House Bill 15-1136 as follows:

42-3-204. Reserved parking for persons with disabilities applicability - definitions - rules. (3) Types of plates or placards. Number of placards and license plates allowed. (II) department may issue two disabled veteran MILITARY license plates UNDER SECTION 42-3-213 OR 42-3-218 (3) with identifying figures or a disabled veteran ONE MILITARY license plate UNDER SECTION 42-3-213 OR 42-3-218 (3) with an additional identifying figure and one placard to an a qualified individual.".

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Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

Page 5, strike lines 7 through 18 and substitute:

Act subject to petition - effective date. "SECTION 7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, this act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) Section 2 of this act takes effect only if House Bill 15-1136 does not become law, in which case section 2 takes effect on the effective

date of this act.

(3) Section 3 of this act takes effect only if House Bill 15-1136 becomes law, in which case section 3 takes effect on the effective date of this act or House Bill 15-1136, whichever is later.".
