FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE
ON SB15-161

THIS REPORT AMENDS THE
REREVISED BILL

To the President of the Senate and the
Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on SB15-161, concerning a supplemental appropriation to the department of revenue, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

That the Senate accede to the House amendments made to the bill, as the amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following changes:

Amend rerevised bill, page 15, line 3, strike "Services" and substitute "~~Services~~ SERVICES^{1a}".

Page 15, line 4, in the ITEM & SUBTOTAL column strike "21,239,549" and substitute "21,138,307" and in the CASH FUNDS column strike "12,308,273^a" and substitute "12,207,031^a".

Page 15, line 6, in the CASH FUNDS column strike "(228.7 FTE)" and substitute "(226.5 FTE)".

Page 15, line 8, in the ITEM & SUBTOTAL column strike "3,446,112" and substitute "3,443,440" and in the CASH FUNDS column strike "1,537,353^a" and substitute "1,534,681^a".

Adjust affected totals accordingly.

Page 16, line 4, strike "\$11,055,980" and substitute "\$10,952,066".

Page 27, after line 8 insert:

"1a DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE, DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES, DRIVER SERVICES, PERSONAL SERVICES -- THE INITIAL FISCAL NOTE ESTIMATED A TOTAL OF 66,000 INDIVIDUALS WOULD REQUEST AN APPOINTMENT FOR A S.B. 13-251 DOCUMENT. CONTINUED OPERATIONS FOR THIS PROGRAM AT MORE THAN ONE OFFICE ARE PREMISED ON THE NEED TO HANDLE THE INITIAL SURGE OF APPLICANTS. IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT ONCE THE ANNUAL APPOINTMENTS MADE AVAILABLE FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT LAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES FALLS BELOW 5,000 PER YEAR OR THE TOTAL APPOINTMENTS SERVED REACHES 60,000, THE DIVISION WILL REDUCE THE OFFICES THAT PROVIDE THE SERVICE TO ONE LOCATION."
