  - (a) When the court's jurisdiction over the child terminates; or (b) Upon discharge by the court on its own motion or at the

- (c) AT ANY TIME WHEN A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN WITHDRAWS HIS OR HER CONSENT THAT WAS PROVIDED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (b) OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION.".
